

**CURRICULUM VITAE of**  
**DR. ENRICO DE AGOSTINI**

Dr. **Enrico DE AGOSTINI** was born in Rome (Italy) on 19<sup>th</sup> May 1964.

He completed his education at the University of Rome on 17<sup>th</sup> January 1989, where he graduated in Law.

He joined the Diplomatic Service on 4<sup>th</sup> March 1991 and, after a 9-month professional training course, on 5<sup>th</sup> December 1991 he began working at the Directorate-General for Development Cooperation at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation in Rome. On 5<sup>th</sup> July 1993 he was transferred to the Embassy of Italy in Abu Dhabi (United Arab Emirates) in the capacity of Second Secretary (Commercial). There he was promoted to the rank of First Secretary (Commercial Affairs) on 4<sup>th</sup> September 1995.

He was posted as First Secretary (Commercial Affairs) to the Embassy of Italy in Accra (Ghana) on 8<sup>th</sup> December 1997 and on 12<sup>th</sup> April 1999 he was appointed as Consul in Dortmund (Germany).

On 5<sup>th</sup> July 2001 he returned to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation in Rome to work at the Directorate-General for Multilateral, Economic and Financial Cooperation.

He was promoted to the rank of Counsellor on 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2001. From December 2001 to June 2002 he attended a further professional training course at the Diplomatic Institute in Rome.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2004 he served as Counsellor at the Embassy of Italy in Maputo (Mozambique) and on 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2007, he was promoted to the rank of First Counsellor. On 18<sup>th</sup> September 2007 he was appointed Consul-General of Italy in Johannesburg (South Africa).

On 1<sup>st</sup> February 2012 he returned to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation in Rome to work at the Directorate-General for Internationalization and Global Affairs.

On 7<sup>th</sup> January 2014 he was appointed Ambassador at the Embassy of Italy in Harare (Zimbabwe). He was promoted to Minister Plenipotentiary on 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2018 and on 14<sup>th</sup> August 2018 he moved back to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation in Rome.

Appointed as Consul-General of Italy in Munich (Germany) on 19<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

In 2013 he was bestowed with the title of Official of the Order of Merit of the Italian Republic.
