

EU Open Day

On 9 May 2013 Europe celebrated the 63rd anniversary of the Schuman Declaration. Sixty-three years ago, on 9 May 1950, the then French Foreign Minister Robert Schuman made the first move towards the creation of what we now know as the European Union (EU). Only five years after the Second World War, he proposed the creation of a supranational European institution. The countries which he called upon had almost destroyed each other, and reconciliation was a brave thing to imagine at that time. This year's celebrations will be especially poignant following the awarding of the Nobel Peace Prize 2012 to the EU.

The EU Delegation together with member state Embassies in Lusaka joined the other European Institutions to celebrate Europe Day worldwide.
